Specific Aims

Stimulate the practice and teaching of research integrity in publicly funded institutions

Why?

Globally, research excellence has increasingly been developed in parallel with initiatives to promote integrity (RI) and responsible conduct in research (RCR). Major concerns include:

Quality of data management, originality of contributions (e.g., problems with redundant results presented as if they were new) , management of conflicts of interest to control for bias in reporting and reviewing results, responsible authorship (focus on accountability -"If you want the credit, you take the responsibility"), stealing of scientific ideas; stealing of text; trust between science & society.

Identify the RI issues that matter most for the Brazilian context

Why?

We have to identify what our main weaknesses are in this context and in which sense RI/RCR related initiatives are meaningful in Brazilian institutions. For example, do we know whether plagiarism is widespread? If so, how much consensus do we have in the country's research community? What about accountability/responsible authorship? Are concepts of authorship/ownership blurred among research areas? If so, is it an issue? Can universities have legal issues in the current environment?
